Prairie Rose will soon be open for the 2021 season

Prairie Rose Golf Club did an amazing job of operating through the pandemic last season.

Following the protocols and guidelines, they were able to offer all of the usual amenities and a chance to enjoy one of Iowa's top nine-hole golf courses.

Hats off to Brandon and Sarah Phelan and their staff for pulling that off. Now, it's time for another season, one in which we hope can return to some form of "normalcy."

The course will open whenever weather permits. We all know, when you live in Iowa, just wait for a minute and the conditions will change.

For much of last season, the clubhouse offered window service because of the pandemic. That should not be the case this year as the clubhouse is scheduled to be fully open. More good news is, membership rates have not changed. As always, if you pay before May 21, you will receive discounted rates.

Following are the 2021 membership prices. Taxes are included:

Family: \$510 before May 21 and \$560 after.

Couples: \$485 before May 21 and \$535 after.

Single: \$405 before May 21 and \$455 after.

High school: \$65 before May 21 and \$100 after.

College: \$150 before May 21 and \$210 after.

Daily fees are \$14 for nine holes and \$20 for 18 holes. Cart rental is \$16 for nine holes and \$20 for 18 holes. There is a daily \$10 trail fee for those bringing their own carts to the course.

A green fee punch card is offered (buy 10 rounds, get 11) for

\$140. A punch card for cart rental only is \$160.

You must be a member to rent a space in the cart shed for \$120. The yearly trail fee is \$60.

Scheduled leagues for 2021 include men's league on Thursday evening, women's league on Wednesday evening, seniors on Wednesday morning and a 2-person best ball league beginning on July 6 on Tuesday evenings.

No tee times are to be scheduled after 6:30 p.m. for any of the leagues. Be sure to check the clubhouse or the Prairie Rose website for a calendar of tournaments and events.

The first tournament of the season is the Memorial Day 4-person scramble on Saturday, May 29 with a 10 a.m. shotgun start.

There will be two tournaments in June, a Senior 2-person scramble on Tuesday, June 1 at 9 a.m. and a 2-person Ryder Cup on Saturday, June 12 at 10 a.m.

The annual Ladies Cancer (Pink) Night is Wednesday, July 14.

The Brunsville Open, an 18-hole individual stroke play event, is Sunday, July 25 with a 10 a.m. start. Nick Dreckman is the defending champion.

An 8-inch cup 4-person scramble signals the end of the tournament season on Sunday, September 19.

Independent Riders for Children & Charities

The Independent Riders for Children & Charities (IRCC) began as two different organizations. Randy "Snowman" Luschen from Merrill, IA formed a group in 1991 called the Independent Riders for Children. They held their first Toy Run in 1992. Robert "Bobbo" Helwig & Dave Van Beek had a group in Sioux Center called Riders for Charities. They had been around since approximately the mid-1990's. Both organizations held their own rides in the beginning. In 2007 they decided to merge the groups due to their similar goals – helping kids. The first charitable cause supported by the Independent Riders for Children was Headstart in Le Mars and they remain one of the primary charities for the IRCC. Other charities which have been assisted by the IRCC are Le Mars Backpack Program, Josh's Ride, Le Mars Police Association (Shop with a Cop Program) and CSADV.

The IRCC was adversely impacted when Baldies began having their charity run on the same day the IRCC traditionally had their Toy Run. This led to some re-thinking of how we were going to re-establish the run to draw more participants. ABATE District 20 members joined the IRCC and added ideas on how to expand the draw of the Toy Run. Enter Blaine Foreman. In its early days the IRCC had either started or ended the Toy Run in Brunsville, IA. In an effort to return to the roots of the organization, Blaine was approached as the owner of The Corner to see if he would allow us to start and end the run at his establishment. Blaine joined the IRCC and provided suggestions to make the Toy Run a viable event again. He generously donated food for after the run and has been a big supporter of the IRCC. After several lean years, in 2019 we had grown back to about 40 participants and increased to roughly 75 participants in 2019.

The IRCC will be holding the 30th Annual Toy Run in 2021 and hope to keep the momentum going.

Due to Blaine's generous support of the IRCC, Danielle Hystad decided she wanted to do something to say "Thank you" for what Blaine had done. Danielle was struggling with what to do when she spoke with Blaine's daughter, Abbey. Abbey told Danielle that Blaine enjoyed doing burnouts. Finding a good photo of a burnout turned out to be more challenging than expected. One day, Carol Hystad was looking at Blaine's FB page and saw the photo of Blaine doing a burnout. A copy of the photo was obtained and Danielle was able to have the photo converted into a Diamond Art project. Once it was received, Danielle spent many hours completing the project. It is conservatively estimated there is in excess of 33,000 gems used to complete the project. Once the gems were placed, then she had it professionally framed so it could be presented to Blaine.
