Mayor: Water report posted

A copy of the "Brunsville Municipal Water Supply" consumer confidence report is posted at the Brunsville post office, Iowa State Bank and the American Legion Hall. It is also available upon request.

Recipe of the month: **Blueberry-Lemon Loaf Cake**

2 c. flour 1/4 tsp. salt 1/2 c. butter 1 c. sugar 2 eggs

1/3 c. milk 1 1/2 tsp. baking powder 1/2 c. chopped walnuts 2 tsp. grated lemon peel 1 c. fresh blueberries 1 tsp. vanilla

Grease loaf pan. Preheat oven to 350°. Sift flour, baking powder and salt together; set aside. Beat butter and sugar until light and fluffy. Add eggs, one at a time. At low speed, beat in flour mixture, alternating with milk. Add vanilla. Beat until combined. Stir in walnuts, lemon peel and blueberries. Bake 60 to 65 minutes.

Lemon glaze:

1 1/2 c. powdered sugar 2 T. + 2 tsp. lemon juice

Mix together. If necessary, add water until smooth. Drizzle over cake while it's warm. I cut the glaze recipe in half.
