## Recipe of the month: Carrot Apple Zucchini Bread

Prep Time: 10 minutes Cook Time: 55 minutes

Servings: 24

Ingredients:

1 cup unsalted butter, melted

2 cups granulated sugar

3 eggs room temperature

1/4 cup fresh orange juice

1 tbsp vanilla extract

31/4 cups all-purpose flour

½ tsp salt

2½ tsp baking powder

3/4 tsp baking soda

1 tsp cinnamon

Pinch of ground cloves

Pinch of ground nutmeg

2 cups shredded carrots

1 cup shredded zucchini

1 cup diced, peeled apple (Granny Smith, Fuji, whatever you have on hand)

½ cup pecans, chopped

Cream Cheese Glaze/Frosting:

½ cup cream cheese, softened

1/4 cup butter, softened

2 - 3 cups powdered sugar

1-3 tbsp orange juice as needed

#### Directions:

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees.

Grease and flour two 8x4 inch loaf pans. Line with parchment paper and set aside. (I use the baking spray with flour in it.) Place zucchini in a large kitchen towel. Bring up the four corners and twist. Squeeze the towel to extract all the liquid from the zucchini, or as much as you can. Set aside.

In a large bowl, whisk together flour, salt, baking powder, baking soda, cinnamon, cloves and nutmeg. Set aside.

In a separate large bowl, whisk together the butter and sugar. Add eggs, orange juice and vanilla and whisk until combined.

Fold dry ingredients into wet ingredients along with the shredded carrots, shredded zucchini, apples and pecans.

Pour into prepared pans.

Bake until golden brown, 55 to 60 minutes, or until loaves spring back when gently pressed with fingers.

Let cool completely before icing.

Cream Cheese Glaze/Frosting:

Cream together cream cheese and butter with a hand mixer. Add in 2 cups of powdered sugar and continue mixing. Drizzle in orange juice until desired consistency is achieved.

Frost bread and enjoy!

Notes: The carrots and zucchini in this recipe are interchangeable. Feel free to use less or more of each. You just want three cups total.

## Dreckman wins Brunsville Open for third time

Prairie Rose Golf Club proved to be up for the challenge of 44 players who took part in the Brunsville Open.

As it turned out, none of the players broke par and just one – Nick Dreckman – matched par.

Dreckman, one of the most accomplished golfers the city of Le Mars has ever produced, shot 72 in the 18-hole stroke play event held on Sunday, July 22.

En route to his third Brunsville Open victory, Dreckman recorded four birdies, along with four bogeys and 10 pars. Dreckman also has several Sioux City "major" tournament victories to his credit, along with many other wins across the area.

Tricky pin placements and fast greens at Prairie Rose, however, confounded some of the best linksters from the area.

Past champion Keegan Bak, who established a nine-hole course record in winning the 2021 title, tied for second place in the first flight with Courtney Driscol. Each shot 3-

over-par 75. Rounding out the placewinners in the top flight was T.J. Tapper with 76.

Al Robinson, a regular at Prairie Rose, was the second flight winner with 81. Alex Klein, Ron DeKok and Nick Knapp were the other place winners, each carding 82.

The third flight winner was Korey Karr with 86, followed by Judd Herzberg at 87 and Josh Grosenheider and Bryan Diediker with 88.

Logan Wenzel claimed the top spot in the fourth flight with 92. Tim Ruhland was second at 93, while Bill Caravan (93) and John Budde (95) were the other placers.

The course, thanks to the tireless efforts of Superintendent Brandon Phelan and his staff, was in its normal immaculate condition. The weather was warm, but winds didn't play much of a factor.

Instead, it was Prairie Rose showing once again that it is a challenge, even for accomplished players.
