# Recipe of the month: Easy Cucumber-Tomato Salad

2 cucumbers 1 onion 3-4 lg. tomatoes Olive oil 1 (8 oz.) pkg. crumbled Feta cheese Salt & pepper

Wash cucumbers and tomatoes. Slice cucumbers, leaving skin on. Wedge tomatoes 1/4 to 1/2-inch thick. Julienne onion. Combine cucumber slices, tomato wedges, julienned onion and Feta cheese in large bowl. Drizzle olive oil over ingredients adding salt and pepper to taste. Stir and chill an hour before serving. Yield: 8 servings.
