Recipe of the month: Spinach, corn and carrot casserole

1 (16 oz.) bag frozen niblet corn, thawed

1 (10 oz.) bag fresh baby spinach, chopped

3 carrots, grated

1 onion, chopped

1 (16 oz.) ctn. sour cream

1 can cream of chicken soup

1 lg. egg

1 (6 oz.) box chicken flavor stuffing mix

1/2 c. butter, melted

Preheat oven to 350°. Lightly grease 9x13-inch pan. In large bowl, combine corn, spinach, carrot and onion. In small bowl, combine sour cream, soup and egg and add corn mixture. Stir to combine well.

In medium bowl, combine stuffing mix and butter. Stir half of corn mixture with stuffing mixture. Spoon this into prepared pan. Sprinkle with remaining stuffing mixture over casserole. Bake for 1 hour.

Can be prepared 1 day ahead. Bring to room temperature before baking.

The Pillsbury Doughboy died yesterday of trauma complications from repeated pokes in the belly. He was 75.

Doughboy was buried in a lightly greased coffin.

Dozens of celebrities turned out to pay their respects including Mrs. Butterworth, Hungry Jack, the California Raisins, Betty Crocker, the Hostess Twinkies and Captain Crunch. The gravesite was piled high with many flours.

Aunt Jemima delivered the eulogy and lovingly described Doughboy as a man who never knew how much he was kneaded.

Born and bread in Minnesota, Doughboy rose quickly in show business, but his later life was filled with turnovers. He was not considered a very smart cookie, wasting much of his dough on half-baked schemes.

Despite being a little flaky at times, he was still a crusty old man and was considered a positive roll model for millions.

Doughboy is survived by his wife Play Dough; three children: John Dough, Jane Dough and Dosey Dough, plus one in the oven. He is also survived by his elderly father, Pop Tart.

The funeral was held at 3:50 for about 20 minutes.
