Recipe of the month: Pizza Hot Dish

1 1/2 lb. hamburger 1 onion, chopped 1 green pepper, chopped

Brown and drain.

1 can Cheddar cheese soup 1 (18 oz.) pkg. noodles, cooked & drained 2 (10 1/2 oz.) cans pizza sauce with cheese Shredded Mozzarella cheese

Add soup. Mix in noodles and pizza sauce. Put in 9x13-inch pan. Bake 30 minutes at 350°. Top with cheese and bake for 5 minutes, or until cheese is slightly melted.
